
## Cinco de Mayo in the Gaslamp Quarter

## Look to the Bay... is that Russell Crowe?

The San Diego Maritime Museum keeps on growing. Strike a pose at the helm of the *H.M.S. Surprise* just like Russell Crowe as Captain "Lucky Jack Aubrey." The ship used in the academy award winning film, *Master and Commander: The Far Side of the World* has found a permanent home at the Maritime Museum. This ship is a magnificent replica of an 18th century Royal Navy frigate. On board visitors will find exhibits featuring artifacts, costumes, weapons and props used in the film. The museum also has a B-39 Soviet Submarine in its historic fleet. The '70s-era diesel electric submarine now berthed in San Diego Bay was an attack sub designed to track US and NATO warships. It could dive safely to a depth of 985 feet.

## The Union-Tribune Race for Literacy

The Union-Tribune Race for Literacy helps promote fitness and philanthropy for one of life's great necessities: the ability to read. It's the largest kids run in California and the second-largest 8K in the United States. All proceeds of this two-day event benefit the San Diego Council on Literacy, which each year provides services to more than 50,000 San Diegans. The Kids' Magic Mile takes place Saturday, May 6 at 8 am. Kids enjoy this one-mile run and walk in Balboa Park at Sixth Avenue and Laurel Street. Food, entertainment, prizes and awards await at the finish line. The 8K Race is Sunday, May 7 at 8 am. This is a scenic 8K run or walk through Balboa Park, down Highway 163, through downtown to Pantoja Park. See your Concierge for more info.
